In November, we did an election day sign wave, helped get people to the polls, and some members volunteered as poll watchers. After the election, we shifted our efforts to supporting veterans. We invited Colonel Becky Loomis to our meeting where she spoke about her experience in the service and we gifted her a beautiful bouquet. She was also our veteran honoree in the Veterans Day Parade where we passed out small flags and candy. The Caring for America committee donated coats and gloves to the Salvation Army.

In December we had a Christmas party where we enjoyed a White Elephant gift exchange and lots of delicious treats.

In January, we focused on renewing dues and Club business such as calendars, budgets, and goals for the new year. NPCRWC President and Vice President attended the Idaho County Republican Women's Club in support of their new president and executive board.

At our February regular meeting, we did a recap of what it means to be an IFRW club: hours and awards and why it matters. We also started the Evening Socials again.
